Brecon Camp takes place over the bank holiday weekend, starting with an opening meeting at 9 pm on Friday 23rd, and running through to the Monday morning. The Sabbath morning meeting starts at 10.30 am.

Brecon Camp is a place to come and relax, bring your friends, enjoy some practical Christian talks and good music, surrounded by the beauty of the Welsh countryside. The schedule we have is very simple: meetings take place in the evening and morning, and the rest is free-time.

We camp in a field on a farm, next to a stream, situated at the north of the Brecon Beacons National Park, which has lots of trails, cycle paths and much more. Usually people bring their own tents and camping equipment, but the Welsh Mission has some tents etc available if you need. The camp is basically self-catering, but this year we can offer meals for limited number of people (for a small fee!). This year I have booked some places at Llangorse Multi-activity Centre (www.activityuk.com) for the Sunday afternoon. The two-hour activity session includes climbing, a high ropes course zip wire and more, and is suitable for any level. The session costs £15.50 (£10 for students: subsidised by the Welsh Mission). Camping fees: The cost for the weekend is £36 per unit. Camping fees will be collected on Monday morning.

Campsite facilities: Aberbran is a self-catering camp which has running water but no electricity. We will have portaloos, and there is also a chemical disposal point for those with caravans. Meetings are held in the marquee.

For you to bring: Apart from all your usual camping gear, please bring a bible, and a musical instrument if you have one (there is a concert on Sunday evening!). Waterproofs and walking shoes are a good idea too. There is a swimming pool in Brecon, and a stream by the campsite, so you might want to bring your swimming gear!
